



SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 3RD
9:30AM MASS

Saint Blaise is the patron of Throat problems and the Wool trade. Blaise was a well educated Physician who became Bishop of Sebaste in Armenia. He was persecuted by Agricola, The famous Roman general, who ordered Blaise to renounce his faith. When Blaise refused he was thrown into prison where he helped sick prisoners and famously saved a child who was choking on a fish bone. Blaise refused to renounce his faith and was tortured by having his flesh torn with wool combs. He was finally beheaded on the orders of Agricola.

Lately there have been several occurrences of Internet Scammers pursuing members of Little Flower Parish for money. They have tried to contact parish members under a fake email address, and claim to be Fr. Lynes. This is a very common scam. The scammer will often try to ask for payment in gift cards (specifically Apple iTunes cards), or via a wire transfer account (such as MoneyGram). Please do not respond to these. Please note that the priests of Little Flower and the Archdiocese would never ask for these things.

If you do receive an email like this, do NOT delete it. (The police need the information from it to trace it to the originator).



THURSDAY THEOLOGICA "CONVERSION"



The first words out of Jesus' mouth in the Gospel of Mark is "μετανοείτε" in the Greek, which means "be converted," "change your mind," "turn around." Each Lent, we Catholics journey into the spiritual desert with Jesus for 40 days in preparation for the great celebration of Easter. It's a perfect opportunity to take a look at our lives, examine our priorities, our behavior, and our mindset, and, with the grace of

God, allow ourselves to be "converted".

To aid us on our journey this Lent, join Fr. Jones and Bishop Robert Barron for a Bible Study on the topic of "Conversion." Each Thursday evening at 6:30pm beginning on February 28th and ending on April 11th, we will look at six Biblical stories of conversion: Bartemaeus, the Rich Young Man, St. Matthew, Jonah, the Woman at the Well, and the Magi. All are invited to join us for this study, and our hope is that it will help you to grow ever deeper in your own relationship with Jesus. Our Lady of Mount Carmel, The Legion Of Mary

Thank you so much for joining us January 4th for our First Friday, Day of Adoration (9:15AM-5:15PM), and Saturday, January 12th for our Holy Hour (9:30-10:30 AM) – you make a big difference! When we gather to bring the needs of the Church and our brothers and sisters world-wide to Jesus in prayer, we speak for all of us, particularly those who have no voices to pray with and no way to know Him. Praying as Church, we thank our Hidden God for being Emmanuel, God-with-us, personally and faithfully, in Scripture, in prayer, in community, and in His sacraments, especially the Eucharist, and for filling us with His Life, Light and Love at every moment.



February's first feast, celebrating both Mary's Purification and the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple, occurs on February 2nd, the 40th day after the Birth of Jesus. The Law decreed every mother had to come to the Temple forty days after her delivery to be ritually purified by offering God every first-born male child belonged to Him and that his parents had to redeem him (Ex 13:11-15), by Presenting him in the Temple and paying a priest the "Redemption Price," of five shekels (Nm 3:47-48). Mary and Joseph did so. They always obeyed God's Law with adoration, joy and humble, grateful love, and so honored the Lord God by their Faith and true Covenant-keeping. They taught Jesus to do the same, and here did for Him what He could not do for Himself.

When Jesus was brought to the Temple by Mary and Joseph, only two other people, neither of them the priest, recognized this peasants' baby boy as the Messiah of God. In these believers, the Old Covenant recognized and silently surrendered in Faith to the New. The first believer was **Simeon**, an old man who had longed for the coming of the Messiah. He had been assured that he would see God's Promised One before he died. The Holy

Spirit brought him to the Temple as Mary and Joseph entered with Jesus, and Simeon, recognizing the Child as the Messiah, stopped them. He took the Child in his arms and told the Lord with satisfaction that He might now take his life. Then, in the grip of the Holy Spirit, Simeon prophesied, "*Behold! This Child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted – [then to Mary] and you, yourself a sword will pierce – that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed.*"

At that point the second believer arrived, **Anna**, an 84-year-old widow. She had spent the nearly 63 years of her widowhood in the Temple, occupied day and night in prayer, worship, and fasting, longing for the Messiah. She came forward, saw the Child, poured out her thanks to God, then promptly proclaimed His coming to everyone, as the shepherds had done before her and the magi would do when the Holy Family arrived home.

And here we are – ending another Christmas Season, more filled with joy, trust and hope than ever before, and looking around to see, love, and serve Him in everyone we encounter, for that is what Faith means, when we live it out. We will suffer again, and in our pain, we will join Jesus in His Passion, but for now, our joy is full! So may it be for all of us. So let us pray.


