

LITTLE FLOWER MUSIC MINISTRY



January 1, 2024? Yes, but hang onto that stable and don't let the camel get away! It's still Christmas in the Church, in spite of insistent January dates! For us blessed believers, Jesus, born in Bethlehem, greeted by angels and shepherds at His birth, is this day the 8-day-old Infant who sheds his first blood for us by Circumcision, receives the Name Jesus from His Father through Joseph, and formally becomes Abraham's son.

Further, on this New Year's Day, the Octave Day of the Nativity, the Holy Spirit, through the Church's Solemnity, honors Jesus' Mother and ours, the Blessed Virgin Mary, as the Theotokos, the Mother of God. We rejoice in Mary's willingness to conceive, bear, and raise the Son of God as her own her own Child, and we cling to her as our Mother, who unfailingly brings us to Jesus, if we permit. Today's mid-Christmas-season Feast carries us to the final Day of Christmas, the Epiphany, (the Sunday between January 2 and 8), when we welcome the Three Magi who honor Jesus as King (gold), God (frankincense) and mortal man (Myrrh, an embalming oil) Who will die for us. This Glory ends here with the fear-filled flight of the magi to their Eastern home and the Holy Family to Egypt to escape the murderous wrath of Herod. Nevertheless, the Season itself ends with a shining light of hope, for the Holy Spirit shows us the arrival of John the Baptist calling all of us to repentance so we can receive the coming Messiah and our eternal salvation.

As for Christmas presents, Mary and Jesus offer TWO periods of Adoration for us –First Friday (1/5) 9:15AM to 5:15PM; Mass following at 5:30 PM, and Second Saturday (!/13) Holy Hour 9:30-10:30AM). They thank us warmly for joining them First Friday (12/1) to keep them company in spite of the world's competition.

How about you? Over-loaded? Frazzled? Worn out? Come Home for a break — any Monday night God sends,6:15 PM Bringer Center — and get to know your Mother, your Brother and us! You'll never be the same again!

The "Little Way" Calendar Little Flower 2024 Donation Calendar

We are excited to announce a new fundraiser for our Parish, the "Little Way" calendar. It is an opportunity for you to dedicate a specific day, such as a birthday, anniversary, or memorial for a loved one.

Funds will be divided equally to support Little Flower Church and School.

Here's how it works: each day of the year is assigned to a specific dollar amount based solely on where it falls in the calendar.

For example,

- *January 1st is valued at \$1
- *January 2nd is valued at \$2
- *January 3rd is valued at \$3
- *And so on, all the way up to December 31st, value \$365.

You can find the calendar and the corresponding dollar values on our website www.littleflowermobile.com by following the link the "Little Way" calendar.

We ask that you pick a date and donate the amount associated with that day. This can be done in honor or memory of someone and their name will appear as follows:

- *On the new digital billboard located on the exterior of the school gym
- *A post on the Little Flower Catholic Church Facebook page (names published once, weekly)
- *A reference in the Sunday Bulletin (names published once, weekly)
- *A morning announcement and prayer at Little Flower School

As an enticement, each donor will be entered in a drawing to win a minimum of \$1,000. If the entire calendar is full, we will draw for \$5,000. For example, January 1 = 1 chance, while December 31 = 365 chances.

Payment can be made by credit card through PayPal, through Venmo, or by mailing a check directly to the office. If you prefer to come to the office, we are happy to assist you in choosing your date! If you have any questions, please call the office at 478-3381.



question - will you keep them??



We just presented our first Source and Summit Night for the parish on December 14th with Fr. John as our first speaker for this leg of the initiative. If you have never heard Fr. John speak or present on the

"Eucharist-And So It Begins" it is truly your loss. Fr. John has an incredibly unique way of highlighting the importance of the Eucharist in the Christian faith through history. He creates a kind of timeline that highlights some of the key moments that prepared the way for the Eucharist in the Old Testament, as well as its institution in the New Testament. Fr. John, like Jesus leaves us with no doubt that who we receive in Holy Communion is without question the true Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. And, so, why is this so important to us? Well, because the celebration of the Eucharist is more than just a memorial of the death and resurrection of lesus. And, more than just His command to "do this in remembrance of Me." By His real Presence in the Eucharist Christ fulfills His promise to be with us always until the end of the age. (Matt 28:20). He has not left us alone on earth. He walks with us side-by-side forever. It is up to us to spend enough time with Him to recognize Him and to return His love. In an age of division and doubt, the Holy Spirit is inviting us to come, come away and spend time with Him. Will we respond? Will we do it?
